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**CAMPAIGN PRIORITIES:**

**For Iowa. Forever More: The Campaign for the University of Iowa** will help the college advance its priorities for students, faculty, programs, and facilities in the following areas:

**FACILITIES:** \$10 million

Building a state-of-the-art facility for the UI College of Pharmacy will greatly enhance its teaching and research efforts and contribute to a much-improved student experience. Equally important, a new facility will be a powerful signal to potential students, faculty, and industry partners—as well as to private and governmental funders—that the UI is committed to providing a contemporary education for its pharmacy majors and aspiring scientists. Finally, this forward-looking space can help Iowa pharmacy take the lead in offering innovative, and fully accessible, educational opportunities for all of its students.

**STUDENT SUPPORT:** \$4 million

The cost of receiving a pharmacy education has skyrocketed, and only 10 percent of UI pharmacy students currently receive named scholarship funding. The college's goal is to provide scholarship assistance to 100 percent of its students.

**FACULTY SUPPORT:** \$6 million

Iowa pharmacy is well known for its basic-science and research faculty, as well as for its faculty who specialize in clinical care; however, competition for the very best is fierce. Attracting and retaining first-rate faculty members is an important priority in the college, and faculty-support funds, endowed professorships, fellowships, and chairs can help Iowa provide beneficial and prestigious faculty positions.

**PROGRAMS AND OTHER INITIATIVES:** \$5 million

Among these programs and initiatives, which enhance the college's educational offerings, include the Hospice and Palliative Care Institute, a center dedicated to interdisciplinary research, education, and training for hospice and palliative care; the 1885 Society and Professional Outreach Development Societies, which promote mentorship, philanthropy, and interdisciplinary collaboration; the Community Pharmacy Residency Program, which achieved the first full accreditation for multisite community-pharmacy residency programs in 1999; and travel support for doctoral students to attend conferences and present at national meetings.

**CAMPAIGN GOAL:** \$25 million
